BANKING AND BUSINESS NEWS

- Government has decided to separate the post of Chairman and Managing Director (MD) Executive Officer (CEO) in public sector banks. In pursuance of the decision, and Chief the government has appointed four Managing Directors and CEOs of following 4 PSU banks:
 - **Koteeswaran** was named as MD and CEO of **Indian Overseas Bank**.
 - **Srinivas** was named as MD and CEO of **United Bank of India**.
 - **Animesh Chauhan** was named MD and CEO of **Oriental Bank of Commerce**.
 - **Kishore Sansi** was named MD and CEO of **Vijaya Bank**.

Above 4 MD's and CEO's will have tenure of 3 years or till the date of superannuation, whichever is earlier.

- Microsoft's Digital Crimes Unit filed a civil lawsuit in federal court against Indian company **C-Cubed Solutions** for misusing its name and registered trademarks by providing fraudulent technical support services to unsuspecting consumers. Microsoft decided to sue these entities after they had received more 65,000 customer complaints regarding fraudulent tech support scams since May 2014.
- ICICI Bank has launched its own 'digital village' project while adopting an entire village in Gujarat to provide services ranging from cashless banking to digitised school teaching. It was launched presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and ICICI Bank MD and CEO Chanda Kochar to mark 60-year-celebration of the ICICI group's existence.
 - Digital village has three themes -- cashless, comprehensive and connected.
 - Village, named Akodara, in Sabarkantha district of Gujarat incidentally happens to be the same place where Modi started Gujarat's first animal hostel in 2011 when he was the Chief Minister of the state
- Know-Your-Customers (KYC) rules for Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs) relaxed by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). As per RBI notification, the KYC exercise will be required to be done in three ways and they are:-
 - For High-risk individual and entities in at least every 2 years For medium risk individuals and entities - in at least every 8 years For low risk individuals and entities – in at least every 10 years
- 5. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) signed an information sharing agreement with United States (US) banking regulators for better coordination with them in supervising financial institutions.
- India's largest private sector bank Industrial Credit and Investment Corporation of India (ICICI) Bank has launched country's first 'contactless' debit and credit cards.
 - These cards will provide its customers to make electronic payments by waving the cards near the merchant terminal instead of dipping or swiping.

- These cards are based on the Near Field Communication (NFC) technology and powered by MasterCard contactless and Visa payWave technologies.
- Kotak Mahindra Bank received its shareholders nod for merger of Bengalaruheadquartered ING Vysya Bank with itself. It was approved by the 99.30 per cent in number representing 99.93 per cent in value of the shareholders present.
- 8. Tata's Vistara airline started domestic flight operation in India. Vistara airline is a joint venture of Tata Sons and Singapore Airlines (SIA).
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on Supervisory Cooperation and Exchange of Supervisory Information with Brazil's Central Bank- Banco Central do Brasil (BCB). This MoU was signed by Anthero de Moraes Meirelles, Deputy Governor for Supervision, BCB and S.S. Mundra, Deputy Governor, Reserve Bank of India
- 10. Technology giant Microsoft unveiled virtual assistant- Cortana for Windows Phone handsets. Cortana is female voice-controlled application uses Microsofts search engine Bing and data stored on the handsets to make personalised recommendations and carry out tasks. It named after AI system in the firm's Halo video game franchise.
- 11. India's largest bank State Bank of India (SBI), signed a loan agreement for 100 million euro (about Rs 700 crore) with European Investment Bank (EIB). This agreement facilitated by SBI Capital Markets, a subsidiary of SBI.
- 12. Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) issued draft regulations to facilitate full mobile number portability (MNP).
- 13. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) lifted ban on carrying Indian bank notes of Rs 1,000 and 500 denominations to and from Nepal, Bhutan. However, RBI has put a limit of carrying such notes at Rs 25,000 per person.
- 14. US technology giant Apple, has reported the biggest quarterly profit of 18 billion US dollar.
- 15. Hike Messenger, a home-grown chat application has introduced free voice-calling feature called Hike Calls to its users. Hike Messenger has introduced this service, after it had acquired free calling application company – Zip Phone earlier in January 2015. This feature launched in beta on Android operating system, which contributes to over 90 percent of Hike's user base. While, the iOS and Windows versions will be released later. Hike Messenger was launched on 12th December 2012 and is a joint venture between Bharti Enterprises and Softbank. In August 2014, Hike had hit 35 million users.
- 16. Union government announced to sell up to 10 per cent stake in state owned Coal India Limited (CIL). It will help the government to raise revenue of 24,000 crore rupees. Government is planning to divest 5 per cent stake in the company via share sale and the remaining 5 per cent through the green-shoe option. Currently, the government holds 89.65 per cent stake in CIL.
- 17. India's online restaurant search and discovery service provider **Zomato announced the** acquisition of Turkey's restaurant search company Mekanist. With this acquisition, Zomato has increased its coverage from about 27,500 restaurants in Istanbul and Ankara to more than 50,000 restaurants across Turkey.

- 18. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) constituted a high-powered panel on urban cooperative banks (UCB). It will be headed by RBI Deputy Governor R Gandhi. This high-powered panel will re-examine and recommend appropriate set of businesses, size, conversion and licensing terms for the UCB sector.
- 19. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) announced sixth Bi-Monthly Monetary Policy Statement on 2 february. In its bi-monthly monetary policy statement, RBI not changed its main lending rate i.e. Repo Rate and cash reserve ratio (CRR). But changed statutory liquidity ratio (SLR) of scheduled commercial banks. RBI has been decided to:
 - **Repo rate** unchanged at 7.75 per cent.
 - Cash reserve ratio (CRR) unchanged at 4.0 per cent of net demand and time liabilities (NDTL).
 - Statutory liquidity ratio (SLR) reduced the SLR of scheduled commercial banks by 50 basis points from 22.0 per cent to 21.5 per cent of their NDTL.
 - **Reverse repo rate** unchanged at 6.75 per cent.
 - Marginal standing facility (MSF) rate- remains unchanged at 8.75 per cent.
 - **Bank Rate** remains unchanged at 8.75 per cent.
 - Earlier on 15 January 2015, RBI had changed repo rate by 25 basis points from 8.0 percent to 7.75 percent.
- 20. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in its monetary policy review enhanced the limit for foreign exchange (FOREX) remittances under Liberalised Remittance Scheme (LRS) to \$250,000 (Rs. 1.5 crore) per person per year. This limit doubled compared to earlier limit of \$125,000 per person per year.

February, 2015

- 21. According to market research firm Canalys report, India's Micromax Mobile overtaken Korean tech giant Samsung as the largest seller of smartphones in India for the first time. As per Canalys report, Micromax accounted for 22% of India's smartphone market share in the October-December 2014 quarter (Q4, 2014). While, Samsung's market share fell down to 20%.
- 22. Union Government is planning to infuse Rs. 6,990 crore in 9 Public Sector Banks (PSB's) for enhancing their capital and meeting the global risk norms. 9 PSBs are: State Bank of India (Rs 2,970 crore), Bank of Baroda (Rs 1,260 crore), Punjab National Bank (Rs 870 crore), Canara Bank (Rs 570 crore), Syndicate Bank (Rs 460 crore), Allahabad Bank (Rs 320 crore), Indian Bank (Rs 280 crore), Dena Bank (Rs 140 crore) and Andhra Bank (Rs 120 crore).
- 23. India's Reliance Communications Limited (RCOM) partnered with social networking giant Facebook to offer free internet access. Both companies have launched Internet.org, a Facebook-led initiative to bring internet to everyone in the world.
- 24. The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has given its approval to increase the Authorised Share Capital of the National Minorities Development and Finance Corporation (NMDFC). As per this decision, NMDFC's Authorised Share Capital has doubled from Rs. 1500 crore to Rs. 3000 crore.

- 25. The Industrial Credit and Investment Corporation of India (ICICI) Bank, launched India's first digital Bank on mobile phones, named Pockets. This service will enable users to instantly send money to any e-mail id, mobile number, friends on Facebook and bank account. Anyone, including those who are not customers of ICICI Bank, can download the e-wallet from Google Playstore. This wallet uses a virtual VISA card which enables the users to transact on any website or mobile application in India.
- 26. US technology giant Apple Inc. became the first company to reach a market value of \$700 billion. It was able to hit this milestone after its shares rose 1.9 per cent and closing at \$122.02, which in turn increased company's market value to \$710 billion.
- 27. Twitter has bought Indian mobile marketing start-up ZipDial (It is Bengaluru based startup, founded in 2011 co-founded by Valerie Wagoner) It will be first Indian technology product startup to be bought by Twitter. This deal is expected to cost Twitter around \$34-35 million (Rs 215 crore). ZipDial's mobile marketing platform gives information about businesses to users when they place a missed call.
- 28. Indian pharmaceutical giant, Cipla has been awarded \$188.95 million (around Rs. 1,172 crore) Contract by Global Fund to supply ARV (anti-retroviral) drugs. Cipla selected as a Panel Supplier for a supplier partnership agreement. This contract is effective from 1 January 2015 and will run for a period of three years i.e. till 2018.
- 29. Kerala-based business conglomerate Muthoot Group launched the Friends for Life project in partnership with World Wide Fund (WWF) for Nature-India. This project aims at effective management of human-elephant conflict (HEC) to protect the habitats of Asian elephants in six states as 4 priority landscapes and 1 priority site earmarked by WWF-India. Priority landscapes include North Bank landscape in Arunachal Pradesh, Kaziranga and Karbi-Anglong in Assam, Terai Arc landscape in Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, Western Ghats landscape in Tamil Nadu and Kerala and also some parts of northern West Bengal. This project was launched in Kochi as part of the Muthoot's Haathi Mera Saathi Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative
- 30. India's software services giant Infosys announced to acquire to acquire US-based automation technology firm Panaya. In this regard, Infosys signed a definitive agreement to fully acquire Panaya for an enterprise value of \$200 million (1200 crore rupees) in cash.
- 31. State Bank of India (SBI) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Indian Army on the Defence Salary Package (DSP). Signed MoU is revised version of the first MoU which was signed on DSP between two parties in 2011 and was valid for a period of three years. The revised MoU meets the requirements of serving soldiers, pensioners and their families.

March, 2015

- 32. Online cab aggregator **Olacabs has acquired TaxiForSure** for \$200 million cash and equity deal. Olacabs was founded in 2010 by two IIT Bombay graduates, Bhavish Aggarwal (CEO) and Ankit Bhati. Its headquarter is located in Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- 33. Union Government and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) have signed an agreement to keep inflation below 6%.

- 34. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on 4 March 2015 has cut down repo rate by 25 basis points to 7.5 percent from 7.75 percent, with immediate effect. However, RBI has kept the cash reserve ratio (CRR) unchanged at 4 percent. After this change now current rates are
 - Repo Rate- 7.5%
 - **Reverse Repo Rate-6.5%**
 - **Bank Rate- 8.5%**
 - MSF-8.5%
 - CRR-4%
 - **SLR-21.50%**
- 35. Indian telecom giant Bharti Airtel and world's largest telecom operator China Mobile have signed a partnership memorandum of understanding (MoU) to work jointly on evolving high technologies like 4G, 5G and procuring telecom devices and equipment. The MoU was signed by China Mobile Chairman Xi Guohua and Bharti Airtel founder and Chairman Sunil Bharti Mittal.
- 36. Anil Ambani-led Reliance Infrastructure acquired Pipavav Defence and Offshore Engineering in an all-cash deal.
 - Reliance Infra will first invest Rs 819 crore to acquire 17.66 per cent stake from the promoters and subsequently an additional 26 per cent stake at Rs 1,266 crore.
 - While, Anil Ambani will take over as chairman of Pipavav Defence with full management control.
 - Reliance Infra with this acquisition has joined a growing list of Indian companies entering the defence sector in a big way.
- 37. Country's third largest software services firm Wipro partnered with the World Economic Forum (WEF) to develop a cyber value-at-risk (VAR) framework.
- 38. Infosys had signed a five-year agreement with Dutch company TNT to help it simplify and transform its technology applications.
- 39. The app, developed in-house by the Hyderabad-based Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) Marine Fishery Advisory Services team is for the benefit of fishermen. There are plans to make available the app on Google Play store and on INCOIS website.
- 40. RBI eased the norms for home loans for up to Rs 10 lakh by allowing banks to include stamp duty and registration charges to the cost of a unit.
- 41. Country's second largest software services firm Infosys set up a 250-seater BPO arm centre at Aguadilla, Puerto Rico, aimed at serving the aviation sector. The 12,000-square feet centre, developed in collaboration with the Commonwealth administration and state-owned PRIDCO, will initially deliver order-to-cash business processes for clients in the aviation sector.
- 42. State Bank of India sold 4 per cent stake in the largest credit information company Credit Information Bureau India Ltd (Cibil) for an estimated Rs 72 crore. Cibil is the largest and the oldest credit bureau in the country having entered the market in 2000.
- 43. The Union government advised PSU banks to step up lending to minorities with a view to ensuring that they get loans in proportion to their population. In term of population, Muslims constitute the largest community, followed by Christians. Third largest minority group is that of the Sikhs.

- 44. The Income Tax Department has slapped a Rs. 20,495-crore tax demand on Cairn India for failing to deduct withholding tax on alleged capital gains made by its erstwhile promoter, Cairn Energy.
- 45. **Facebook** has acquired the shopping search engine **TheFind**. With the acquisition, the social networking giant Facebook has signaled its future plans to move into the ecommerce. The acquisition aims to improve Facebook ads experience and lift its digital advertising business. The technology of TheFind will be integrated into Facebook in order to make ads more relevant and better for consumers.
- 46. Online marketplace major Snapdeal picked up minority stake in logistics firm **GoJavas** as it looks to further strengthen its delivery operations in the country. Snapdeal, which has more than 60,000 sellers on board and more than 40 million registered users. has been dependent on third party services such as Blue Dart, GoJavas, Ecom Express for handling deliveries in the country.
- 47. Hitachi India Ltd and Siemens Ltd signed an MoU with the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) to form a consortium that would create pilots and replicate them throughout the country for setting up 100 smart cities.
- 48. US-based Mirach Capital said it is initiating a \$400 million defamation lawsuit against the Sahara group. The crisis-hit group had alleged that Mirach and its CEO Saransh Sharma's criminal conduct and lack of financial capabilities to honour such huge commitments led to the breaking down of the deal.
- 49. HDFC Bank has launched **Chillr**, a mobile app that allows users to instantly transfer money to any contact in their phonebook 24 hours a day and seven days a week.
 - HDFC Bank partnered with MobME, a Kochi-based technology firm, to launch this app.

NATIONAL NEWS

- 1. Union government blocked access to 32 websites for carrying anti-India views and spreading banned terrorist outfit Islamic State of Iraq and Syria's (ISIS) propaganda, after following an advisory given by an anti-terrorism team.
 - They were **blocked by Department of Telecom(DoT)** under Section 69 of the Information Technology Act, 2000 and under Information Technology (Procedure and Safeguards for Blocking for Access of Information by Public) Rules, 2009.
- 2. Delhi police has launched women safety mobile application 'Himmat'. It was launched by the Union home minister Rajnath Singh in New Delhi.
 - It is an android based mobile app.
 - After downloading the app, new user has to register them with the Delhi Police website by sharing their name, mobile number and that of a minimum of two relatives/friends.
 - In case of emergency, user can send an alert by shaking her phone or by pressing the power button/soft button.

- 3. Union government has renamed Planning commission as National Institution for Transforming India (NITI) Aayog. The renaming of the Planning Commission is being seen as the first step towards replacing it with a new-age institution.
 - It will serve as a 'Think Tank' of the government i.e. a directional and policy dynamo.
 - It will also provide governments at the central and state levels with relevant strategic and technical advice across the spectrum of key elements of policy formulation.
 - Composition
 - **Chairperson** Prime Minister.
 - **Governing Council-** It will consist of- Chief Ministers (of States) and Lt. Governors (of Union Territories).
 - **Regional Council-** It will be formed on need basis. It will compromise Chief Ministers (of States) and Lt. Governors (of Union Territories).
 - **Vice-Chairperson** To be appointed by the Prime Minister.
 - ➤ **Members** Full time Basis and Part time members- Maximum of 2. They will from leading universities research organizations and other relevant institutions on a rotational basis.
 - Ex Officio members- Maximum of 4 members of the Union Council of Ministers to be nominated by the Prime Minister.
 - > **Special invitees** They will be nominated by the Prime Minister and will be experts, specialists and practitioners with relevant domain knowledge as special invitees.
 - **Chief Executive Officer-** Appointed by the Prime Minister for a fixed tenure, in the rank of Secretary to the Government of India. Secretariat- If deemed necessary.
- 4. Gujarat government announced its new industrial policy for 2015. This industrial policy aims to make state a global manufacturing hub by playing a pivotal role in realising Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 'Make in India' dream.
- 5. A suspicious fishing boat carrying explosives from Pakistan was intercepted by Indian Coast Guard in Arabian Sea near Indo-Pak maritime boundary but it sank after the crew on board set it on fire. The incident came a month after sixth anniversary of the Mumbai terror attack.
- 6. Union Government launched Management Information System (MIS) to check progress and implementation of Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana (DAY) scheme in different states. It was launched by Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation (HUPA) Minister M Venkaiah Naidu.
- 7. Union Government extended the **Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958** for another one year in Assam and has declared the entire 'state of Assam' as a 'Disturbed Area'. Besides Assam, government has declared the area falling within 20 km wide belt along the border of Assam with Arunachal Pradesh and Meghalaya as Disturbed Area.
- 8. Sixty-six wild tiger deaths reported in the country in 2014. Two tiger deaths occurred on the last day of the year. As per the National Tiger Conservation Authority, the highest number of wild tiger deaths reported from the forests of Tamil Nadu -15, followed by Madhya Pradesh -14.

- 9. United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) decided to prepare a Tea Atlas in India's North Eastern State Assam. This atlas seeks to create a comprehensive database of the tea gardens and socio-economic condition of its workers in state.
- 10. International Hindi Conference-2015 (अंतर्राष्ट्रीय हिंदी सम्मलेन-2015) will be hosted by New Jersey, United States in April 2015. Theme of 2015 edition of this conference is **Expanding World of Hindi: Possibilities and Challenges.**
- 11. Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched National Programme for LED-based Home and Street Lighting in New Delhi for energy conservation by reducing energy consumption and Described LED bulb as a '**prakash path**' (way to light).
- 12. The Centre nominated cricketer V.V.S. Laxman, chess player Koneru Humpy, playback singer S.P. Balasubrahmanyam as brand ambassadors of Swachh Bharat campaign.
- 13. Prime Minister Narendra Modi released commemorative coins to honour Tata Group founder Jamsetji Nusserwanji Tata. PM released coins in the denomination of 100 and five rupee to mark Jamsetji Tata's 175th birth anniversary.
- 14. Central government launched the sale of subsidised 5-kg LPG cylinders scheme for Below Poverty Line (BPL) families and others. It was launched by Union Petroleum Minister Dharmendra Pradhan in Bhubaneswar, Odhisa.
- 15. President Pranab Mukherjee signed the ordinance that amend's Citizenship Act, 1955. Citizenship Act amendments will benefit PIO and will give them benefits like life-long visa and exemption from appearing before the local police station on every visit etc.
- 16. Punjab become first state in India, to completely ban the sale of loose cigarettes (even as single sticks) and loose tobacco.
- 17. Pakistan government enacted new law, to create constitutional military courts to try and punish terrorists. This new law came into effect after it was signed by Pakistan President Mamnoon Hussain.
- 18. Nobel Peace Prize winner Kailash Satyarthi dedicated his prize to the nation. He presented his medal to President Pranab Mukherjee in a ceremony held at Rashtrapati Bhavan and it has been put up for display at Rastrapati Bhavan Museum
- 19. Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi inaugurated **the Dandi Kutir museum** in Gujarat's capital of Gandhinagar. It is a state-of-the-art three-storey museum, based upon the life and works of Mahatma Gandhi. It was inaugurated on the occasion of the 13th Pravasi Bhartiya Divas (PBD) and 7th edition of Vibrant Gujarat.
- The 19th National Youth Festival begun in Guwahati, Assam. This festival coincides 20. with the 152nd birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. Theme of this edition of youth festival is Youth for Clean, Green and Progressive India.
- 21. President Pranab Mukherjee signed an ordinance to amend the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 as per Article 123 of Constitution. This ordinance will pave the way for plying of e-rickshaws on roads of Delhi.
- 22. Union Government merged Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) card-holders with Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card-holders. PIO card-holders henceforth are deemed to be OCI card-holders with effect from 9th January 2015. Now only OCI cards facility with enhanced benefits will exist to provide maximum possible benefits to Indian Diaspora.

- 23.3 day Flamingo Festival has begun at the famous brackish water of Lake Pulicat in Nelapattu Bird Sanctuary located at Nellore district of Andhra Pradesh. It was hosted in Doravari Satram mandal, in Nellore district. This festival provides a unique opportunity for people, particularly ornithologists, environmentalists, bird watchers, forest and tourism officials
 - To study the bio-diversity of Pulicat and Nelapattu Bird Sanctuary
 - To initiate measure to conserve the bio-zones for future generations in this area.
- 24. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated 7th Vibrant Gujarat Summit in Mahatma Mandir, Gandhinagar. Inaugural ceremony was attended by United Nations General Secretary and US State Secretary John Kerry.
- 25. People from 11 countries have taken part in First Buddha Heritage Walk in Bihar. In this heritage walk over 500 pilgrims from 11 countries (from Japan, China, South Korea, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, Vietnam, Taiwan, Indonesia, Malaysia, Brazil, and India) walked through a 13-km-long forest trail. They walked through the trail which Lord Gautam Buddha had taken to reach Rajgir from Bodh Gaya around 2,543 years ago. It was organized by Bihar State Tourism Development Corporation (BSTDC).
- 26. United Nations (UN) Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon inaugurated Gujarat's second canal-top 10-MW solar power project. It is located on 5.5 km from Vadodara branch of Sardar Sarovar project canal. It is implemented by Hyderabad-based Megha Engineering and Infrastructure Limited (MEIL).
- Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley adopted 4 villages in Vadodara district in Gujarat as 27. part of the Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana. He adopted following 4 villages; Karnali village, Pipaliya village, Valida village and Baglipura village.
- 28. Sun Temple at Konark, Odhisa declared Adarsh Monument tag by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI). Along with Sun Temple, three other monuments of eastern India were given Adarsh Monument tag are Hazarduari Palace in Murshidabad district of West Bengal, Vaishali-Kolhua in Bihar, Rang Ghar in Sibsagar (Sivasagar) district of Assam.
- 29. Idukki district of Kerala has become first district in India to have high speed Rural Broadband Network i.e. National Optical Fibre Network (NOFN) Internet connectivity (largest rural connectivity project of its kind in the world).
- 30. India and Bangladesh inaugurated third border haat in Srinagar-Purba on the Tripura-Bangladesh border.
- 31. India's first compressed natural gas (CNG) powered train between Rewari and Rohtak in Haryana. It was flagged off by Union Minister for Railways Suresh Prabhu at Rewari junction of the Northern Railway zone.
- 32. **Tribal Food Festival-2015** begun in New Delhi. It was inaugurated by Union Tribal Affairs Minister Jual Oram.
- 33. Union Cabinet gave nod for conducting FM Phase-III auction and renewal of Private FM Radio licenses from Phase-II to Phase-III in 69 existing cities for 135 channels.
- President Pranab Mukherjee launched the Pulse Polio Immunization(PPI) Programme by 34. administering polio drops to children at the Rashtrapati Bhavan. It launched by President ahead of the National Immunization Day which is observed on 18 January.

- 35. Union HRD Minister Smriti Irani laid the foundation stone for Indian Institute of Management (IIM)-Visakhapatnam at Gambheeram village of Visakhapatnam district of Andhra Pradesh.
- 36. Andhra Pradesh government signed a pact with the International Crop Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) to boost sustainable farming in the state.
- 37. Union Government reconstituted Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC). In this regard, government has appointed 1 chairperson and 9 board members. Filmmaker Pahlaj **Nihalani appointed chairperson**. He will be office in for a period of three years or until further orders, whichever is earlier.
- Punjab government launched e-stamping project in the state. It was launched by 38. state Deputy Chief Minister Sukhbir Singh Badal. This project seeks to computarise revenue departments of the state in order to remove malpractices and end leakage of government revenue. It also seeks to make revenue transactions safe and secure. At present, e-stamping has been initiated as a pilot project in five districts of state. They are Mohali, Amritsar, Jalandhar, Ludhiana and Bathinda.
- 39. Maharashtra Government declared mineral rich Chandrapur district (in Vidarbha region) as dry district. Thus imposing ban on the sale, purchase, production and consumption of liquor in the district.
- 40. As per tiger census report 2014 released by Union environment minister Prakash Javadekar, the population of tigers in India increased from 1,706 in 2011 to 2,226 in 2014.
- 41. Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) entered into Guinness book of World **Records**. In one week, 18,096,130 bank accounts were opened as part of the financial inclusion campaign from 23rd to 29th August, 2014. It was achieved by the Department of Financial Services (Government of India).
- 42. Japanese automaker Toyota Motor Corp. topped in global vehicle sales in 2014 by selling 10.23 million vehicles, beating Volkswagen and General Motors.
- 43. The High Level Committee (HLC) for Restructuring of Food Corporation of India (FCI) chaired by Shanta Kumar submitted its report to the Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- 44. National Voters' Day (NVD) observed on 25th January. This year i.e. 2015 is fifth National Voters' Day and theme of this year is Easy Registration, Easy Correction.
- 45. Wing Commander Pooja Thakur became the first woman officer to lead the ceremonial Guard of Honour at Rashtrapathi Bhavan. On 25 January 2015, she led the ceremonial Guard of Honour which was inspected by the U.S. President Barack Obama at Rashtrapathi Bhavan.
- 46. India will provide fund of Rs 1500 crore to Nepal's Pancheshwar multi-purpose project on Mahakali river for countering the Kheri floods in Uttar Pradesh.
- 47. For the first time in the history of India's Republic Day, all-women contingent from the three forces Army, Air Force and Navy marched down in the parade.
 - **Army contingent** was led by **Capt Divya Ajith**.
 - Navy contingent was led by Lieutenant Commander Priya Jeyakumar.
 - Air Force contingent was led by Squadron Leader Sneha Shekhawat. Each contingent had 148 women personnel.

- 48. Gujarat Technological University (GTU) launched e-Raksha Research Centre to curb rising menace of cybercrimes. Gujarat Technological University (GTU) headed by the state government and came into existence on the 16th of May, 2007.
- 49. Maharashtra government announced that, September 17 (on Vishwakarma Jayanti) will be observed as Industries Day in each district.
- 50. Maharashtra government has issued Letter of Intent (LoI) to buy Dr Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar's London house to the Indian High Commission in United Kingdom (UK).
- 51. Supreme Court (SC) directed search engines like Google India, Yahoo and Micrsoft's **Bing** to block advertisements on sex determination and strictly comply with the laws. This ruling was given by SC bench comprising of Justices Dipak Misra and Prafulla C. Pant on public interest litigation (PIL) filed by Dr. Sabu Mathew George in 2008.
- 52. The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) made packaging of foodgrains & sugar in jute material mandatory for jute year 2014-15. In this regard CCEA mentioned that packaging with jute material will be mandatory for minimum 90 per cent of production in case of food grains and 20 per cent in case of sugar production. With this decision, government is seeking to help the jute sector which generates a lot of livelihoods for farmers and workers.
- 53. The World Bank released report Scaling the Heights: Social inclusion and sustainable development on Himachal Pradesh. It was released by Social Justice and Empowerment Minister Dhani Ram Shandil in Shimla. This was first of its kind report prepared by the World Bank for Himachal Pradesh. The report reveals that state has effectively balanced economic growth with social inclusion.
- 54. Gujarat government launched Taluka Planning Atlas (TPA) project. Taluka Planning Atlas (TPA) project undertaken by the state planning department with the help of director of Economics and Statistics, Gujarat and Bhaskaracharya Institute for Space Applications and Geo-Informatics (BISAG). TPA aims to help the local administration in taking effective decisions about the development in respective regions.
- 55. Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay launched Mass Open Online Courses (MOOC) in three subjects, computer programming, thermodynamics, and signals and systems in collaboration with edx a not-for-profit initiative by Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and Harvard University.
- 56. Maharashtra government gave nod to confined genetically modified (GM) food trails in state. In this regard, state government granted no-objection certificates (NOC) for open field trials of 5 genetically modified (GM) crops. They are rice, chana (chickpeas), maize, brinjal and cotton.
- 57. Union Government has released set of three Commemorative Postage Stamps on Swachh Bharat Mission (Clean India Mission). This set of 3 stamps was released by Union Ministry for Communications & Information Technology and issued by Department of Posts.

February, 2015:

- 58.29th Surajkund International Crafts Mela begun Faridabad district of Haryana was inaugurated by Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar along with Chief Minister of Chhattisgarh, Raman Singh.
 - The **theme state** this year is **Chhattisgarh**.

- **Lebanon is the Partner Nation** of this year's Mela and it will be open till 15 February 2015. 17 other countries also participated in this mela this year.
- 59. Wildlife SOS in collaboration with Uttar Pradesh (UP) Forest Department and Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) launched Jackal Research & Translocation Project in UP. Under this project, study and translocation of 30-35 wild jackals from Akbar's Tomb in Sikandra, Agra to safe natural habitat will be undertaken.
- 60. India's 1st solar fenced elephant sanctuary will come up near Bengaluru, **Karnataka**. It was announced by an international animal rights and conservation group People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA).
- 61. The 17th edition of Bharat Rang Mahotsav has begun in New Delhi. It is a theatre festival, organized by National School of Drama (NSD). It was inaugurated by Culture Minister Dr Mahesh Sharma and National Award-winning actor and NSD alumnus Om Puri.
- 62. Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) launched cash on delivery (CoD) system for rail ticketing. With this initiative, passengers can now book a rail ticket online and get it delivered at home where the payment can be made. IRCTC launched this CoD scheme on pilot basis. Initially, this service will be available in more than 200 cities.
- 63. Haryana government launched e-registration of properties in all tehsils and subtehsils of the state. It launched by Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar. Previously in January 2015, pilot project of this system was implemented successfully in eight tehsils.
- 64. Bihar government decided to provide free education to Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST) and girl students till Post Graduation (PG) level in the state. This decision was taken at the state cabinet meeting headed by Chief Minister Jitan Ram Manjhi.
- 65. Maharashtra Government is planning to revamp the Jeevan Amrut Yojana (blood-on**call) scheme** to make it more beneficial to people. State government is seeking to strengthen the network of blood storage units in rural areas instead of current mechanism of transporting blood through motorcycles.
- 66. Kolkata become India's first Wi-Fi-enabled metro city as the service was launched from Park Street in city. This 4th Generation (4G) free Wi-fi service was launched by West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee. The whole city is expected to come under Wi-Fi coverage by mid-April in 2015. Private telecom operator, Reliance Jio is providing the 4G enabled service Wi-fi s in the city.
- 67. Two beneficial algal species Ulva paschima Bast and Cladophora goensis Bast were discovered off the west coast of India. These species have excellent carbon capture properties i.e. ability to absorb carbon dioxide from the atmosphere. They were discovered by Dr. Felix Bast and two research students working with him.
- 68. Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi constituted three sub-groups of Chief Ministers within National Institution for Transforming India (NITI) Aayog. It was announced by PM while he was chairing the first meeting of the Governing Council of NITI Aayog in New Delhi.
 - First sub-group- It will study the 66 centrally-sponsored schemes and recommend which schemes should continue, which should be transferred to states, and which to discontinue.

- **Second sub-group** It will focus on skill development and creation of skilled manpower within states.
- **Third sub-group** It will decide on the institutional mechanisms to be evolved for Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan, so that cleanliness becomes a part of life in perpetuity.
- 69. Union Government's Sukanya Samridhi Yojna under Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) campaign has begun in Jaunpur district in the state of Uttar Pradesh. The first account under the scheme was opened in the name of a three-year old girl Vedika Tiwari in this district by her parents.
- 70. Election Commission of India (ECI) has declared the results of Delhi Legislative Assembly election 2015. Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) head Arvind Kejriwal with 67 seats emerged as the largest party in the house of 70 seats. BJP won only 3 seats.
- 71. First World Ocean Science Congress (WOSC) concluded in Kochi, Kerala. The fourday-long event had started in Kochi on 5 February 2015.
 - Themes of WOSC-2015: Protect Oceans for Posterity and Blue Economy.
- 72. First National Deworming Day was observed on 10 February. On the eve of the National Deworming Day, Union Ministry for Health & Family Welfare launched the National Deworming initiative launched by Union Minister for Health & Family Welfare Jagat Prakash Nadda in Jaipur, Rajasthan.
- 73. Four new fish species named Puntius nelsoni, Puntius nigronotus, Systomus chryseus and Systomus rufus have been discovered in Kerala. They were discovered by Mathews Plamoottil, a zoology professor at Baby John Memorial Government College in Kollam.
- 74. Union government warned States to complete Socio Economic and Caste Census (SECC) before 15 March 2015. If states fail to complete the exercise before 15th March, the central assistance to states for building rural houses and welfare pensions will be blocked.
- 75. 35th National Games mascot Ammu-the Great Hornbill, has made into the Limca **Book of Records**. It made into the record books owing to a play Kalikkunna Kuttikalkkayi Bharatham Kathirikkunnu (India Awaits Children Who Play) in which Ammu is featured as lead role, this play is about a mascot, which had been staged in most number of schools. By 9 April 2014, the play had been staged in 147 schools across seven districts of Kerala.
- 76. Himachal Pradesh government launched Crime and Criminal Tracking Network System (CCTNS) Project in the state. This project will enable the State Police to raise the benchmark of professional efficiency besides catching interstate criminals more quickly. It was launched by Chief Minister Virbhadra Singh from State Police Headquarters in Shimla.
- 77. Fourth River festival begun at Bandrabhan bank of Narmada River in **Hoshangabad district in Madhya Pradesh.** Three day festival inaugurated by Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan. Theme of this year's river festival is River, its catchment area, chemicals and crisis. In this year's festival more than 100 participants will discuss topics like effects of chemicals used in agriculture on forests, wild life and human beings. Success stories on natural farming will also be part of discussion.
- 78. The 23rd edition of the New Delhi World Book Fair began at Pragati Maidan in **New Delhi**. This year the theme of fair is Suryodaya: Emerging Voices from Northeast India. Singapore has been accorded the Guest of Honour Country status for this edition of fair

while the Focus Country is South Korea. The nine-day event has been organised by National Book Trust (NBT).

- The Delhi Book Fair is India's oldest book fair organized at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi. First Delhi Book Fair Was held in March 1972 and was inaugurated by then President of India VV Giri.
- 79. Nearly 56,000 cases were disposed of by the third National Lok Adalat in a single day. It also saw disbursal of Rs 265 crore as claims towards final settlement in bank recovery and cheques bounce cases. The third National Lok Adalat was organised on 14 February 2015 throughout India involving the Supreme Court, high courts, districts courts and taluka-level courts, except in Assam and Uttar Pradesh. It was organised under the patronage of Chief Justice of India (CJI) H L Dattu and the leadership of Supreme Court Judge Justice T S Thakur.
- 80. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated a **Permanent Judicial Museum at Bombay High Court** located on the ground floor of the heritage building of court. This museum is conceived and set up as part of the Sesquicentennial Celebration (150th year) of the Bombay High Court.
- 81. Union Ministry of Finance imposed an anti-dumping duty on imports of graphite electrodes used in steel plants for five years. The imposed duty ranges between \$278.19 and \$922.03 per tonne. Anty dumping duty is duty imposed by government on imported products which have prices less than their normal values or domestic price.
- 82.10th edition of Aero India show has begun at the Yelahanka Air Force Station in Bengaluru, Karnataka. It was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Aero India Show is a biennial air show and aviation exhibition held in Bangaluru at the Yelahanka Air Force Station.
- 83. The first National Tribal Festival 'Vanaj' concluded on 18 February 2015 in New Delhi. It was organised by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and was inaugurated by the Union Minister of Tribal Affairs Jual Oram on 13 February 2015 at the Indira Gandhi National Center for Arts (IGNCA), New Delhi.
- 84. Bihar government has announced 35% reservation for women in non-gazetted government jobs in group C and D grade.
- 85. Union Government launched a single window government-to-business (G2B) portal- e-Biz (www.ebiz.gov.in) for 11 Central government services to bring transparency and ease of doing business in the country.
- 86. Union Government approved various highway projects in states of Uttar Pradesh, Odisha and Chhattisgarh worth over Rs 8,600 crore. The work for these approved road projects will be under the National Highways Development Project (NHDP) Phase-V.
- 87. Union Government launched Consular Grievances Monitoring portal named MADAD (Help) - Because You Are Us. MADAD an e-portal will help Indian citizens living abroad to file consular grievances online on the services offered by the Indian Missions and Posts abroad.
- 88.3rd Tortoise Festival organised on the banks of Hajong Lake in Dima Hasao district of Assam by Dima Hasao Environment and Forest Department. This festival aims to create awareness among the villagers surrounding villages of Hajong Lake about the safety of the

- endangered tortoise species available in the area. Hajong Lake is popularly known as the tortoise lake, is a natural habitat of the few unique tortoise.
- 89. As per World Bank's recently released report Building Resilience for Sustainable Development of the Sundarbans, environmental damage in the climate change-hit islands of Sundarbans is costing India Rs. 1,290 crore each year. This report was jointly prepared by World Bank in collaboration with the West Bengal government.
- 90. Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports amended National Sports Awards Schemes. The amended schemes include Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award, Arjuna Award, Dhyan Chand Award and Dronacharya Awards. These amendments were based upon several suggestions made by selection committee for Arjuna Awards headed by Kapil Dev.
- 91. The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) removed the interconnection usage charges (IUC). Earlier, IUC of 20 paise was charged for calls made from landline to landline or landline to mobile. TRAI also reduced network IUC on calls made from mobile phones by about 30 percent to 14 paise per call from 20 paise earlier.
- 92. Rajya Sabha passed the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Orders Amendment Bill, 2014. It was unanimously passed by a voice vote. The bill seeks to modify the list of Scheduled Castes in three states- Haryana, Karnataka, Odisha and one Union Territory- Dadra and Nagar Haveli.
- 93. Union government accepted recommendations of the 14th Finance Commission (FC) as per its agenda of cooperative federalism. The accepted recommendations are for the five-year period 2015-16 to 2019-20.
 - The 14th Finance Commission was constituted in January 2014. Commissions chairman was former RBI governor Y V Reddy. In December 2014, Commission had submitted its report to the President Pranab Mukherjee..
- 94. Union Cabinet gave nod for creation of two additional benches of the Authority for Advance Rulings (AAR- Income Tax). Two additional benches of the AAR will be established in New Delhi and Mumbai.
- 95. Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) amended regulation to allow Pan-India Mobile Number Portability (MNP). In this regard, TRAI has issued 6th amendment to the Telecommunication Mobile Number Portability Regulation, 2009. It will come into effect from 3rd May 2015.MNP enables mobile telephone users to retain their mobile telephone numbers when changing from one mobile network operator to another.
- 96. Haryana government decided to increase the cash reward under the inter-caste marriage scheme from 50,000 to 1 lakh rupees.
- 97. **First Assamese dictionary** for Science and Technology terms was released recently. It was released by Dr Alok Kumar Buragohain, Vice Chancellor of Dibrugarh University.

March, 2015

1. Defence Acquisition Council (DAC) gave approval for afresh Mine Counter Measure Vessel (MCMV) project worth over Rs 32,000 crore. This decision was taken by DAC meeting chaired by Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar. MCMV project will built specialized vessels for the Indian Navy as per Make in India policy at Goa Shipyard Limited (GSL) in collaboration with a foreign manufacturer.

- 2. **Mufti Mohammad Sayeed** sworn-in as Chief Minister of Peoples Democratic Party-Bhartiya Janta Party (PDP-BJP) coalition government of Jammu & Kashmir. As a person he became 9th Chief Minister of J&K and 12th Chief Minister as tenure wise. Deputy Chief Minister-Nirmal Singh (BJP).
- 3. Election Commission of India (ECI) has launched National Electoral Roll Purification and Authentication Programme (NERPAP). For the authentication purpose, Electoral Photo Identity Card (EPIC) data of electors will be linked with Aadhar data.
- 4. World's largest and tallest Indian national flag was unfurled on 3 March 2015 at Town Park in Faridabad, Haryana.

Features of Flag:-

- It has dimension of 96 feet by 64 feet and weighs 48 kilograms.
- Flag was hoisted at a height of 250 feet (75 meters). Thus, making it the world's largest and the highest hoisted Indian flag in the world.

It was unfurled by **Bhartiya Janta Party President Amit Shah.** On this occasion Haryana Chief Minister ML Khattar and Bollywood Actor Ranbir Kapoor were also present. The unfurling event was organised by Nav Chetna Trust.

- 5. Union Ministry of Shipping, Road Transport & Highways launched a website Shipping Samvad. It was launched by Union Minister of Shipping, Road Transport & Highways Nitin Gadkari in New Delhi.
- 6. President Pranab Mukherjee gave his assent to the Maharashtra Animal Preservation (Amendment) Bill, 1995. It received assent nearly after 19 years it was passed by State Assembly in 1995.
- 7. Maharashtra government **scrapped 5 per cent job quota** for Muslims in the state. In this regard Devendra Fadnavis led BJP-Shiv Sena government released a Government Resolution (GR). The GR also states that an ordinance to provide 5 per cent job quota had lapsed on December 2014.
- 8. Parliament passed the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill, 2015. It was passed by Rajya Sabha on 4 March and earlier by Lok Sabha on 2 March 2015. This bill will replace an ordinance promulgated in this regard and amend the Citizenship Act, 1955.
- 9. Nepal and India launched a direct bus service linking cultural cities Kathmandu and Varanasi.Kathmandu-Varanasi-Kathmandu bus service was launched under the ambit of Motor Vehicle Agreement between India and Nepal signed during 18th SAARC Summit.
- 10. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated two units each of 600 Mega Watt (MW) capacity in Shree Singaji Thermal Power Project in Khandwa district of Madhya Pradesh. Shree Singaji Thermal Power Plant is a coal-fired project. It is owned and developed by Madhya Pradesh Power Generation Company Limited (MPPGCL).
- 11. Time Magazine has named Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi among the list of 30 most influential people on the internet.
- 12. National Payments Corporation (NPCI) linked 15 crore Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) accounts with the Aadhaar numbers. With this achievement NPCI has moved a step closer to map its target of linking all 17 crore DBT accounts with Aadhaar numbers by 30 June 2015.
- 13. Union Government has released 'Digital Gender Atlas for Advancing Girls Education' a web-based tool for advancing girls education. It was unveiled by the Department of School

Education and Literacy in the Union Ministry of Human Resources Development (HRD) in New Delhi. The web based tool developed with the support of United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to identify low performing geographical pockets for girls on specific gender related education indicators.

- 14. North East India's first Kisan Call Centre (KCC) was opened in Agartala, Tripura. It was launched by **Tripura Chief Minister Manik Sarkar**. The call centre is financed by Tripura government and will be run by experts of agriculture, fisheries, horticulture and animal husbandry from a private enterprise.
- 15. Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the first indigenously developed and manufactured Rotavirus vaccine-Rotavac. The vaccine will boost India's efforts to combat infant mortality due to diarrhoea. This is the third such vaccine available globally against Rotavirus.
- 16.8th edition of India-Nepal Combined Exercise Surva Kiran VIII concluded on 8 March 2015 at Salijhandi in Nepal.
- 17. World's first solar powered aircraft on global journey-Solar Impulse 2 successfully landed in Ahmedabad, Gujarat. The aircraft was piloted by Swiss pilots Bertrand Piccard and Andre Borschberg from its first halt Muscat, Oman.
 - Solar impulse started its 35000 km long journey from Abu Dhabi (UAE). Its first halt was in Muscat (Oman).
 - Flight route and Stops- It will stop in Ahmedabad and Varanasi in India, Mandalay (Myanmar), Chongging & Nanjing (China).
- 18.On 10 March 2015, 46th Raising Day of Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) observed.On the occasion of CISF Raising Day, President Pranab Mukherjee and Prime Minister Narendra Modi greeted all the CISF officers, soldiers, civilians, ex-servicemen and their families.
- 19. Delhi High Court in its ruling has held that Attorney General of India comes under the ambit of Right to Information (RTI) Act, 2005. This ruling reversed the previous decision of the Central Information Commission (CIC) which had held that Attorney General does not come under RTI
- 20. Union Government announced that 5 sick public sector undertakings (PSUs) will be closed. It was announced by Union Heavy Industries Minister Anant Geete while replying to a question in the Lok Sabha. The 5 sick PSU that will be closed include HMT and its three units. Hindustan Shipyard. Government also announced that while closing these PSUs, their employees will be provided with very good VRS package
- 21. Parliament has passed the Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Bill, 2015. It was first passed in Lok Sabha on 3 March 2015 and later in the Rajya Sabha on 11 March 2015.
- 22. Country's literacy rate rased to 72.98 per cent in 2011 compared to 64.84 per cent in 2001. It was informed by HRD Minister Smriti Irani
- 23. Parliament has passed Insurance Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2015. It was first passed in Lok Sabha on 4 March 2015 and later in Rajya Sabha on 12 March 2015.
- 24. The World Wildlife Day was observed on 3 March 2015. The 2015 theme of the day is Wildlife crime is serious, let's get serious about wildlife crime.
- 25. Foreign Secretary S Jaishankar completed his **SAARC Yatra** of four nations on 4 March 2015. His SAARC Yatra started on 1 March 2015 and ended on 4 March 2015. He undertook the SAARC Yatra with an aim to firm up India's ties with members of the grouping while reviewing regional and bilateral cooperation. During the Yatra, he visited four countries namely Afghanistan, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Bhutan.
- **26.British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC)** released a documentary film India's Daughter. The documentary film has been **directed by Leslee Udwin**. The film is based on

the Delhi gang rape and murder of the 23-year-old female named Nirbhaya that took place on 16 December 2012. The film was simultaneously released in Denm ark, Sweden, Switzerland, Norway and Canada.

- . A Delhi court has restrained the media from publishing, broadcasting, telecasting or uploading the interview on the internet.
- 27. Artificial glacier in the form of Ice stupa inaugurated at Phyang village in Ladakh region of Jammu and Kashmir. Phyang village is a desert region of Ladakh.
 - The purpose of building such stupa is to store water to green the entire desert of Phyang which has an area of 1500 acres.
 - The Ice stupa with a height of 50 feet will store roughly two million liters of water while another 6 million liters of water absorbed in the ground will add moisture to the earth for tree plantation.
- 28. Union Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari launched a web portal, www.inampro.nic.in. INAM-PRO, which stands for platform for infrastructure and materials providers, will monitor the supply of cement and hasten the process of orders by prospective users and agencies with the respective cement manufacturers.
- 29. Retirement fund body EPFO's trustees decided to raise the age limit from 58 to 60 years for vesting of pension.
- 30. Maharashtra government would be developing a new city 'NAINA' over an area of 600 sq km around the upcoming Navi Mumbai International Airport.
 - As a part of the smart city mission of the Centre, the state government will develop 30 towns, focusing on "themes" such as education, medical, entertainment, industry, etc.
- 31. Law Commission of India in its 255th report on electoral reform pitched for stronger Election Commission of India (ECI). The report submitted to Ministry of Law and Justice by Law Commission Chairman Justice A P Shah.
- 32. IMF Chief Christine Lagarde is on a two-day India visit. During her visit, she met Prime Minister Narendra Modi and key leaders including Finance Minister Arun Jaitley and RBI Governor Raghuram Rajan. IMF has previously expected a 6 percent growth for India.
- 33. Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 14 March 2015 flagged off the first train from Thalaimannar to Madhu Road in North Sri Lanka.
- 34. Union Government has selected legendary boxer and five-time world boxing champion MC Mary Kom as Brand Ambassador for the North East Region. It was announced by Union Minister of Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) Jitendra Singh
- 35. Union Government merged Green India Mission (GIM) with the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) Scheme.
- 36. Researchers have found Endophytic alga belonging to *Ulvella leptochaete* species thriving in the Indian Ocean. This species of alga is originally inhabitant to the seas around the British Isles and the East China Sea.
- 37. Haryana Government passed Haryana Gauvansh Sanrakshan and Gausamvardhan Bill, 2015 that bans cow slaughter.
- 38. Supreme Court (SC) has rejected the notification issued by Union Government to include Jats in the Central list of Other Backward Classes (OBC) for the benefit of reservation.
- 39. Parliament passed Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Orders Amendment Bill, 2015. The bill was first passed in Rajya Sabha on February 24, 2015 and later in Lok Sabha on March 17, 2015. The Bill amends the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order, 1950 and the

Constitution (Dadra and Nagar Haveli) Scheduled Castes Order, 1962. The Bill adds the following communities to the list of Scheduled Castes:

- Haryana: Kabirpanthi, Julaha.
- Karnataka: Bhovi, od, odde, Vaddar, Waddar.
- Odisha: Dhoba, Dhobi, Dom, Dombo, Duria Dom, Katia, Kela, Nalua Kela, Khadala and Turi.
- Dadra and Nagar Haveli: Chamar.
- 40. Union Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF) has revoked 3 year-old suspension of environmental clearances (ECs) of mines in Goa. It was announced by Goa Chief Minister Laxmikant Parsekar.
- 41. Election Commission announced that Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) and ballot papers will carry photographs of candidates from 1 May 2015. This move of EC seeks to avoid voters being misled by several namesakes in the election fray
- 42. The Lok Sabha passed the Warehousing Corporations (Amendment) Bill, 2015. The Bill seeks to amend the Warehousing Corporations Act, 1962.
- 43. National Green Tribunal (NGT) announced a fine of Rs 5,000 on individuals spotted littering or throwing waste on the railway platforms and tracks. It was announced by a NGT bench, headed by Chairperson Justice Swatanter Kumar.
- 44. Union Ministry of Railways constituted 'Kaya kulp' Council, an innovation council for Indian Railways. The council was constituted by Union Minister of Railways Suresh Prabhu in order to fulfill the promise made in the Railway Budget Speech.
- 45. Union Government on 19 March 2015 launched Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC) AcE Fund to accelerate growth of entrepreneurs in Biotechnology. It was announced by Minister of State (MoS) for Science and Technology (S&T) and Earth Sciences Y.S. Chowdary on the occasion of the **third foundation** day of **BIRAC in New Delhi**.
- 46. Parliament passed Coal Mines (Special Provisions) Bill, 2015. It was first passed in Lok Sabha on 4 March 2015 and later in Rajya Sabha on 20 March 2015. This bill will replace the Coal Mines (Special Provisions) second ordinance, 2014.
- 47. Parliament passed Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Bill, 2015. The bill was first passed in Rajya Sabha and later in Lok Sabha on 20 March 2015.
- 48. Union Cabinet approved 33 percent reservation for women in police forces of all seven Union Territories (UTs) including Delhi Police.
- 49. Union Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change (MoEFCC) gave coastal regulatory zone (CRZ) nod to the 6,000-MW Mithivirdi Nuclear Power Plant of Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) in Bhavnagar district of Gujarat. The clearance was granted by MoEFCC for constructing an intake and outfall facility in the plant.
- 50. World Water Day is marked on 22 March. It is observed to preserve and ration consumption of water. The **theme** for this year is 'Water and Sustainable Development'.
- 51. India has become the third-largest steel producer in the world by overtaking United States (US) in first two months of year 2015. It was revealed in the Data compiled by World Steel Association (WSA). China topped the position followed by Japan.
- 52. Maharashtra Government announced to rename Girgaum Chowpatty as Swaraj Bhoomi to honour veteran freedom fighter Bal Gangadhar Tilak.
- 53. The environment ministry will be launching the National Air Quality Index, a simple, composite, and easy to understand measure of air quality, on April 6.
- 54. Megastar Amitabh Bachchan roped in as the brand ambassador for Union Government's campaign against Hepatitis B, a critical public problem in India.

- 55. India will host the seventh Asian Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (AMCDRR) in 2016.
- 56. The Gender Park, an institution under the state department of Social Justice, is organising the three-day International Conference on Gender Equality (ICGE -I) here with the support of UN Women from November 12-14.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

- Tropical storm **Jangmi** hit Surigao del Sur province on northern Mindanao in Philippines. This tropical storm is locally is known as Seniang.
- 2. India and Pakistan exchanged the list of their nuclear installations and facilities under the agreement on Prohibition of Attack against Nuclear installations between India and Pakistan. This bilateral agreement signed between Indian Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi and Pakistani counterpart Benazir Bhutto, bars both nations from carrying out any surprise attack on each other's nuclear installations and facilities.
- 3. Greece's Prime Minister Antonis Samaras dissolved the country's parliament ahead of snap elections. Dissolution of Parliament comes after it failed to elect the President in the third and final round of voting.
- 4. Indian Railway's construction company (IRCON) restored the rail track between Jaffna and Kankasanthurai in North Sri Lanka. This 18 kilometer track passes through the high security zone which was freed from the control of Tamil tigers in 2009.
- Japanese automaker Honda agreed to pay US 70 million dollars in fines to the US authorities for failing to report safety issues involving its cars. It was announced by the US regulator National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) after Honda had accepted liability for the breach on safety issues.
- 6. United States designated Maulana Fazlullah, chief of Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) an outfit of Pakistan's Taliban as global terrorist.
- 7. A British-built space probe **Beagle 2** has been found on the surface of Mars, 11 years after it was thought that it was lost on Mars. It was discovered in the high-resolution images taken by HiRISE camera mounted on NASA's Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter (MRO).
- 8. According to US scientists, year 2014 was the hottest year on record, with global average temperature increasing about 0.8 degrees Celsius since 1880. It was revealed by two separate analyses carried out by NASA and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).
- 9. Mali Government declared country Ebola free. It was announced after no new case of deadly virus reported in last 42-day period.
- 10. First successful organ donation from a newborn baby taken place in UK
- 11. According to the United Nations World Economic Situation and Prospects (WESP) 2015 report, India's growth in terms of GDP is expected to reach 5.9 per cent in 2015 and 6.3 per cent in 2016.
- 12. European Union (EU) decided to lift seven-month-long ban on the import of mangoes from India. In this regard, a European Commission committee unanimously voted to lift the

- ban. The ban was lifted after an audit carried out by the European Commission's Food and Veterinary Office in India in September 2014.
- 13. President Mansour Hadi of Yemen along with Prime Minister Khaled Bahah.
- 14. Britain's Queen Elizabeth II is now the world's oldest living monarch. Currently she is 88 years old. Earlier, Saudi Arabia's King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz was oldest living monarch.
- 15. Colombia's Paulina Vega crowned 63rd Miss Universe. Miss USA Nia Sanchez from Las Vegas named a runner-up, along with Miss Ukraine Diana Harkusha.
- 16. US President Barack Obama become the first American President to be Chief Guest on Republic Day celebrations. He is also the first American President to visit India twice (earlier he had visited India in November 2010).
- 17. Church of England has consecrated Reverend Libby Lane as its **first female bishop** in a ceremony held at York Minster (a Gothic cathedral) in northern England.
- 18. India challenged a World Trade Organisation (WTO) panel's ruling that challenges country's ban on United States (US) poultry product imports. In this regard, India has appealed to the Dispute Settlement Board (DSB) of the WTO.
- 19. Astronomers discovered a star that is 11.2 billion years old and has at least five Earth-size planets. It was discovered by team of astronomer's after analyzing data from NASA's planethunting Kepler spacecraft for over four years.

February, 2015:-

- 20. National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) has launched Soil Moisture Active Passive (SMAP) satellite to observe soil moisture. It was launched from the Delta 2 rocket from Vandenberg Air Force Base in California.
- 21. Russia, India and China called for an early conclusion of negotiations on the Comprehensive Convention on International Terrorism in the **RIC Forum held in Beijing**. India's External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj, Chinese foreign Minister Wang Yi and Russian foreign Minister Sergey Levrov had participated in the meeting.
- 22. As per United Nations Conference of Trade and Development (UNCTAD) report, China has overtaken the United States (US) as the top destination for foreign direct investment (FDI).
- 23. **Britain became the first country** in the world to allow the creation of babies with **DNA from three people** after MPs voted for the controversial procedure.
- 24. A symposium, Towards Zero Poaching in Asia concluded in Kathmandu, Nepal. This is five-day anti-poaching symposium started on 2 February 2015, hosted by the Ministry of Forests and Soil Conservation of Nepal.
- 25. A painting of two Tahitian girls named as Nafea Faa Ipoipo (When Will You Marry) by the French artist Paul Gauguin sold for 300 million dollars. It makes the painting as the most expensive work of art ever sold. This painting was painted in 1892 and was sold to a museum in Oatar.
- 26. China took a firm step to implement its vision of the **Silk Road Economic Belt** an initiative to integrate the economies of Asia and Europe along the Eurasian corridor - by putting into operation its \$40 billion infrastructure fund for this purpose.
- 27. World's first humanoid robot-staffed hotel is set to open in Nagasaki, Japan in July 2015. The Henn-na Hotel which means Strange Hotel will be employing Robots as its

- staff and other advanced technologies in order to significantly reduce operating costs. The hotel will come up with a Huis Ten Bosch theme park which is named after a town of Netherlands.
- 28. The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) adopted a unanimous resolution to resolve the political and security crisis in Yemen.
- 29. China opened new embassy in Islamabad, Pakistan.
- 30. United States (US) and Turkey signed an agreement to train and arm moderate Syrian opposition forces taking on Islamic State (IS) militants.
- 31. Thailand's parliament under ruling military junta has passed a legislation banning commercial surrogacy. Provisions of new law:-
 - Completely bans foreign couples seeking to have children through Thai surrogate mothers.
 - Only married Thai couples or couples with one Thai partner who have been married at least three years can seek surrogacy.
- 32. United States (US) announced to provide work permits to spouses of H-1B visa holders from 26 May 2015. Under existing US laws, spouses of H-1B visa holders are not eligible to work. This announcement is expected to benefit thousands of talented and professional spouses who settled in US but are unable to work.
- 33. Researchers from Australia's Monash University created world's first 3 Dimensional (3D) printed jet engine. The first of kind 3D printed engine was developed by team of researchers from Monash Centre for Additive Manufacturing in partnership with spin-out company Amaero Engineering.

- 34. China launched a massive Silk Road infrastructure project worth \$79.8 billion in the northwest province of Gansu as part of its ambitious Silk Road plan. The Silk Road projects are part of China's ambitious Silk Route plan, which involves maze of roads and ports connecting Asia, Europe and Africa.
- 35. Oxford dictionary has added words ride-share, unboxing, bioprinting and vishing related to Technology in the new list.

Oxford dictionary defined these words as:-

- **Ride-share-** to participate in an arrangement in which a passenger travels in a private vehicle driven by its owner, for free or for a fee, especially as arranged by means of a website or app.
- **Bioprinting-** The use of 3D printing technology with materials that incorporate viable living cells. For e.g. to produce tissue for reconstructive surgery.
- **Unboxing-** An act or instance of removing a newly purchased product from its packaging and examining its features, typically when filmed and shared on a social media site.
- Vishing- It is like phishing, but using phone calls or voice messages instead of emails to trick people in revealing sensitive information.
- 36. Sri Lanka's newly elected government temporarily suspended constriction work of China's ambitious port city project in Colombo with immediate effect. Colombo Port City project is the

- single-largest foreign direct investment in Sri Lanka worth 1.5 billion dollar. The project was inaugurated in September 2014, by Chinese President Xi Jinping.
- 37. The European Union (EU) formally adopted climate change targets for December 2015 UNFCCC Paris Conference. Adopted climate change target includes a 40 per cent cut in emissions by 2030.
- 38. Islamic State (IS) militants destroyed the ruins at the ancient city of Hatra located in southwest of Mosul in Northern Iraq. City of Hatra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site was founded 2,000 years ago, in the days of the Parthian Empire.
- 39. Global food prices fell to a nearly five-year low in February this year on increased supply of key food items and strong US dollar, according to the United Nations food agency FAO.
- 40. Former Maldivian President Mohamed Nasheed was convicted and sentenced to 13 years in prison.
- 41. Historic bronze statue of Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi was unveiled at the Parliament Square in London. It was unveiled jointly by British Prime Minister David Cameron and Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley.
- 42. Powerful **cyclone Pam** slammed the south Pacific archipelago of Vanuatu. Vanuatu is located north east of Australia to south west of Hawaii Islands.
- 43. Three nations from European Union (EU) France, Germany and Italy have agreed to join the China-backed Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) after the United Kingdom (UK) decided to join the bank.

- 2. Union government has launched a Heritage City Development and Augmentation **Yojana (HRIDAY)** scheme to preserve and rejuvenate the rich cultural heritage of the country. Union governments ambitious Rs 500 crore HRIDAY project launched by Urban Development Minister Venkaiah Naidu in New Delhi. In the initial phase, 12 heritage cities have been identified which will be rejuvenated and developed under HRIDAY. The 12 cities are: Amritsar, Varanasi, Gaya, Puri, Ajmer, Mathura, Dwarka, Badami, Velankanni, Kanchipuram, Warangal and Amaravati.
- 3. Union Government launched ambitious Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao(BBBP) campaign to save and empower girl child. The scheme launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi from Panipat in Haryana. The Ministry of Women and Child Development (WCD), is the nodal agency for the implementation of the scheme. While, Centre has provided initial corpus of 100 crore rupees for it. It will be implemented in 100 districts of the country, including 12 districts of Haryana.
- 4. The Union Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports revised the Scheme of Rashtriya Khel **Protsahan Puruskar.** This scheme was introduced by government in 2009 to encourage involvement of corporates and sports promotion boards in the development of sports in the country.Revised Scheme of Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puruskar According to the revised plan, this scheme will be given in following four categories.
 - They are Identification and nurturing of budding/young talent.
 - Encouragement of sports through Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR).
 - Employment of sportspersons and sports welfare measures.
 - Sports for Development.
- 5. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has launched nationwide Soil Health Card (SHC) scheme in Suratgarh Under town of Sriganganagar district, Rajasthan. During the launch PM gave slogan- Swasth Dharaa. Khet Haraa (Healthy Earth, Green Farm).
 - This scheme Centre plans to target over 14 crore farmers in the next three years. In financial year 2014-15, around 3 crore farmers will be covered to check the excess use of fertilisers.
 - Soil Health Card (SHC) scheme announced by NDA government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in its first budget presented in July 2014.
 - In the budget, government allotted Rs. 100 crore for issuing cards under the scheme. Government also had allotted additional Rs. 56 crore to set up 100 mobile soil testing laboratories across India.
- 6. Haryana Government launched 'Aapki Beti Humari Beti' Scheme. It was launched by Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar at **Panchkula district** of state.

Facts about Aapki Beti Humari Beti scheme:-

- This scheme aims to combat the problem of declining child sex ratio in Haryana.It will be implemented in in both rural and urban areas of the state.
- This scheme covers first-born girl child in Scheduled Caste (SC) and Below Poverty Line (BPL) families on or after January 22, 2015. The girl child born in these families is eligible to receive Rs. 21,000.
- It also covers all second girl child born on or after January 22, 2015 of all families. In this case the girl child is eligible to receive Rs. 21,000.
- While, in families where twin girls or multiple girls are born, each girl child will get Rs. 21,000.

Along with this scheme, Haryana Government also launched 'Haryana Kanya Kosh' for the welfare and development of girl child and women in the state. Multi Sectoral Nutrition Programme was also launched to address the maternal and child nutrition in five districts of state. They are Narnaul, Palwal, Mewat, Kaithal and Fatehabad.

- 7. Maharashtra government has launched **Bhagyashree scheme** for girls. The scheme replaces state government's previous Sukanya scheme. Bhagyashree scheme was launched by was launched by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis along with the actress Bhagyashree who is brand ambassador of the scheme.
 - Under the Sukanya scheme, the state government was to earmark an amount of Rs. 21,200 for each girl child born in a Below the Poverty Line (BPL) family.
 - While the Bhagyashree scheme aims at providing one lakh rupee on maturity after the girl completes 18 years of age.
 - State government is seeking to link the Bhagyashree scheme with the Union Government's Beti Bachao Beti Padhao scheme.
- 8. Union Government launched **Pharma Jan Samadhan scheme**, for redressal of grievances of consumers related to drug pricing and availability of medicines. It was launched by Union Chemicals and Fertilizers Minister Ananth Kumar in New Delhi.

About Pharma Jan Samadhan scheme

- The scheme is a web-enabled system created by National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA).
- It seeks to serve as a robust E-governance tool for protection of interests of consumers through effective implementation of the price of drugs.
- The scheme will provide consumers with an online facility to redress their complaints related to over-pricing of medicines, non-availability of medicines and refusal of supply for sale of any medicine without good and sufficient reason.
- After receiving the complaint, NPPA will initiate action on any complaint within 48 hrs.
- The scheme also seeks to create awareness among the people and act as a deterrent against black-marketing, spurious medicines and inflated cost of drugs by creating phama-literacy initiative.
- 9. The Union Cabinet approved the **Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY)** to provide skills training to youth across the country.

About Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY)

- The PMKVY Scheme will be implemented by the Union Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship through the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC).
- It will provide skills training to youth, including class 10 and 12 drop outs and aims to cover about 24 lakh people.

- The target for skilling under the scheme will be associated with Union Government's flagship programmes such as Make in India, Digital India, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and National Solar Mission.
- The skill training will involve soft skills, good work ethics, personal grooming, behavioural change for cleanliness etc.
- Inspection of training under PMKVY will be done by Sector Skill Councils and the repective State Governments.
- The skill training will be undertaken on the basis of demand assessed on the basis of skill gap studies conducted by the NSDC for the period 2013-17.
- **Fund Allocation-** The scheme will be implemented with an outlay of 1, 500 crore rupees. Of the total 1,500 crore rupees, about 1,120 crore rupees will be spent on skill training of 14 lakh youth.
- 150 crore rupees allocated for training of youth from the North-East region.

- 2. The 5th General Assembly of the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA) held in Abu Dhabi. In total it has 138 Members. India is one of the 33 Permanent members of IRENA.
- 3. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the first Renewable Energy Global Investors Meet and Expo (Re-Invest) 2015 in New Delhi. Germany is the partner country for Re-Invest 2015 and over 2500 delegates including exhibitors from 45 countries are participating in the three day event.
- 4. The 5th India- Myanmar Joint Trade Committee (JTC) meeting was held in Nay Pyi Taw, Myanmar. The JTC meeting was co-chaired by Minister of Commerce & Industry Nirmala Sitharaman and Myanmar Union Minister of Commerce U Win Myint. Both sides had intensive interaction and exchanged views to find ways and means to enhance the bilateral trade and investment ties.
- 5. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Indian Science Congress 2015 at the Mumbai University. The theme of 102nd Congress is Science and Technology for Human Development.

DEFENCE, ARMY EXCERCISE AND SPACE

- 1. Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully tested an advanced electronic warfare (EW) suite. It was tested onboard of the country's Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas-PV1.
- 2. Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh handed over Resident Identity Card (RIC) readers to Navy Chief Admiral R K Dhowan and Coast Guard Director General Vice-Admiral A G Thapliyal. It aims to strengthen coastal security measures in 9 states and 4 Union Territories which have a sea-line running along their borders.
- 3. First indigenously-built Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas handed over to the Indian Air Force (IAF) by Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar at ceremony held at Bengaluru, Karanataka.
- 4. For the first time, a canisterised version of **Agni-V missile** successfully test-fired from Wheeler Island off Odisha coast. This was the third successful flight test of the Inter-Continental Ballistic Missile (ICBM) and the first canister trial.
- 5. Pakistan conducted a successful flight test of the indigenously developed Air Launched Cruise Missile (ALCM) Ra'ad.
- 6. The Naval Prototype 2 (NP2) of indigenously developed light combat aircraft (LCA) Tejas undertook its successful maiden flight in Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- Indian Coast Guard inducted a high-speed patrolling ship **Amogh** into its fleet. Amogh will be stationed off Paradip coast in Odisha. It can travel at maximum speed of 63 km per hour The ship has facilities like firing gun, rubber boats including one motor-run, GPS system and upgraded radar system.
- 8. Unmanned SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket successfully launched from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station, Florida on its third attempt.
- 9. Indian Navy had conducted Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster relief (HADR) exercise in Lakshadweep Islands (Kavaratti, Aggatti, Kalpeni and Androth). HADR was Indian Navy's large scale exercise to test its readiness for handling a tsunami like disasters in order to provide immediate succour and relief to the affected people.
- 10. India successfully test-fired its 290-km range BrahMos supersonic cruise missile from the Navy's indigenously built destroyer INS Kolkata. INS Kolkata was commissioned by the Indian Navy on 16 August 2014. The ship was indigenously built by Mazagon Dockyards Limited under Project 15-Alpha series.
- 11. India successfully test-fired its nuclear capable Prithvi-II surface-to-surface missile from a test range at Chandipur in Odisha. Test- It was conducted by the Strategic Force Command (SFC) and monitored by the scientists of Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).
- 12. Union Government announced 27 Indian satellites are currently operational. It was announced by Minister of State for Prime Minister Office (PMO) & Department of Space

- Jitendra Singh said during Question Hour of Lok Sabha. Among the 27 operational satellites, 11 are communication satellites, 12 are earth observation satellites, 3 are navigational satellites and 1 is Mars orbiter mission.
- 13. Indian Navy's Theatre Level Readiness and Operational Exercise (TROPEX) exercise concluded. TROPEX-2015 was a month long exercise aimed at validating the Indian Navy's Concept of Operations and the area of operations spanned the Arabian Sea and Northern Indian Ocean.
- 14. World's first electric satellites successfully lifted off by a Space Exploration (SpaceX) Technologies rocket from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station, United States. The satellites are owned by the French satellite provider Eutelsat and Asia Broadcast Satellite (ABS).
- 15. NASA's **Dawn** space probe completed its orbit around dwarf planet **Ceres** which is the largest object in the Solar System between Mars and Jupiter. With the completion of orbit, Dawn probe become first spacecraft to visit dwarf planet. Dawn has taken 7.5 years to reach the orbit of Ceres
- 16. Pakistan successfully conducted the first test of surface-to-surface **Shaheen-III** ballistic missile off the Arabian Sea. The missile, also called White Falcon-III in English developed by Pakistan's Space and Upper Atmosphere Research Commission (SUPARCO) and NESCOM along with its subsidiary NDC.
- 17. In a breakthrough, Japanese researchers successfully transmitted electric power wirelessly to a pinpoint target using microwaves, an advance that brings space-based solar power closer to reality.
 - According to Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency, or Jaxa, the researchers were able to transform 1.8 kilowatts of electric power into microwaves and transmit it with accuracy into a receiver located 55 metres away.
 - In space-based solar power generation, sunlight is gathered in geostationary orbit and transmitted to a receiver on Earth.
- 18. Pakistan successfully tested first indigenously built all-weather armed drone named **Burraq** and a laser guided missile named Barq. By successfully testing of Burraq, Pakistan became the 9th country in the World to develop an unmanned combat aerial vehicle (UCAV) domestically.
- 19. NASA launched four identical spacecraft on a billion-dollar mission to study the explosive give-and-take of the Earth and sun's magnetic fields.
- 20. NASA's **Hubble Space Telescope** spotted massive saltwater ocean under the icy crust of Jupiter's largest moon Ganymede.
- 21. Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is planning to collaborate with other space agencies on inter-planetary explorations. It was announced by Minister of State (MoS) in the Prime Minister's Office Jitendra Singh in the Lok Sabha. Presently ISRO is having talks with space agencies of the United States of America, Russia and France to collaborate for inter-planetary explorations.
- 22. India's indigenously developed Beyond Visual Range (BVR) air-to-air missile Astra was successfully tested from a Sukhoi-30 fighter aircraft. The test was undertaken at the Integrated Test Range located at Chandipur in Odisha.

PRIME MINISTER NARENDRA MODI'S FORIGEN VISIT

Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Seychelles:-.

Narendra Modi is first Prime Minister to visit Seychelles in 34 years. Previously, late Prime Minister Indira Gandhi had visited the country in 1981.

- Both nations agreed to set up joint working group to promote ocean based economy i.e. on Blue Economy. In this regard, India committed to provide all help to Seychelles.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi also announced free visa on arrival (VoA) and free visas for three months facility to the citizens of Seychelles.
- Four agreements and MoUs were signed between both the countries. They were signed in the fields of renewable energy, hydro graphic survey, electronics navigation and infrastructure **development** at the island of Seychelles.
- These agreements and MoU's were signed by Secretary (West) Navtej Sarna from Indian side in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President of Seychelles James Alix Michel.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi also inaugurated a Coastal Surveillance Radar system (SSRS). The surveillance system has set up in Seychelles with the help of India.
- India also announced to provide 2nd dossier aircraft to the island nation to enhance maritime security.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Maurities:-

During Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to island nation as part of three-nation tour of Sevchelles, Mauritius and Sri Lanka for cementing strategic partnership with these island courtiers. India and Mauritius have inked 5 Memoranda of Understanding (MoU) to give new impetus to bilateral co-operation. These MoUs were signed in Port Luis, Mauritius.

Following MoUs were signed

MoU in the field of Ocean Economy-

- It will provide an extensive framework for cooperation in the field of Ocean Economy between two countries for sustainable development in the Indian Ocean Region.
- It includes mutually beneficial cooperation for exploration and capacity development in the field of marine resources, green tourism, fisheries, research and development of ocean technology, exchange of experts and other related activities.

Programme for Cultural Cooperation between both nations for the year 2015-18

- The programme will provide enhanced bilateral cooperation between both nations in this field for the term 2015-2018. It will enhance people-to-people participation between the two countries
- The programme envisages exchange of cultural troupes, organization of cultural exhibitions, preservation of cultural heritage, training in fine arts, promotion of Indian languages, exchange of students, etc.

Protocol between both countries for the importation of fresh mango from India

The aim of this Protocol is to facilitate Mauritius with importation of world-renowned Indian mangoes. This protocol is between India's Union Department of Agriculture and Cooperation and Ministry of Agro-Industry and Food Security of Mauritius.

MoU for the Improvement in Air and Sea Transportation Facilities at Agalega Island of Mauritius

- It provides provisions for setting up and upgradation of infrastructure for improving sea and air connectivity at Agalega Island of Mauritius and Outer Island.
- These facilities will help to enhance the capabilities in safeguarding interests of the Mauritian Defence Forces in the Outer Island.

MoU on Cooperation in the field of Traditional System of Medicine and Homeopathy

- It will promote cooperation in the field of traditional system of health and medicine between the both countries.
- It envisages exchange of experts, joint R&D and recognition of the traditional systems of health and medicine, supply of traditional medicinal substances, in both countries.
- It also aims to promote and popularization of the various Indian traditional systems of AYUSH.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Sri Lanka:-

Following are the main highlights of visit:-

- It is the first standalone bilateral visit to Sri Lanka by an Indian Prime Minister since 1987.
- Lanka IOC and Ceylon Petroleum Corporation have agreed to jointly develop the Upper Tank Farm of the China Bay Installation in Trincomalee on mutually agreed terms.
- Early commencement of work on the ground in the Sampur Coal Power Project. This landmark project would meet Sri Lanka's energy needs.
- The facility of "Tourist Visa on Arrival Electronic Travel Authorization" Scheme to Sri Lankan citizens from the Sinhala and Tamil New Year on 14 April 2015.
- Air India will soon start direct flights between New Delhi and Colombo.
- Cooperation in developing a Ramayana Trail in Sri Lanka and a Buddhist Circuit in India.
- Organization a Festival of India in Sri Lanka later this year. Sri Lanka is where Buddhism has truly flourished. We will be organizing an exhibition showcasing our Buddhist heritage as part of this festival.
- The Memorandum of Understanding on cooperation in youth affairs is an important long term investment in our relationship.
- A fresh Line of Credit of up to US\$ 318 million for the railways sector. This will be used to procure rolling stock, and to restore and upgrade existing railway track.
- Assistance for the construction of the Rabindranath Tagore auditorium at Ruhuna University in Matara.

- The Reserve Bank of India and the Central Bank of Sri Lanka have agreed to enter into a Currency Swap Agreement of US\$ 1.5 billion. This will help keep the Sri Lankan rupee stable.
- Modi became the first PM to visit Jaffna

During the visit, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 14 March 2015 flagged off the first train from Thalaimannar to Madhu Road in North Sri Lanka.

It marks the completion and restoration of the prestigious project of Indian Railways to restore the North-South Rail link of Sri Lanka after decades of civil war. The North-South Rail link was completely destroyed by the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) militants during the civil war in 1980s.

Key facts

- The rail project connects the Sri Lanka's Jaffna province to capital Colombo and a branch line connects Thalaimannar to the main rail line.
- The project has been implemented by Indian Railway Construction Company Limited (IRCON) International, a subsidiary of Indian Railways.
- Indian Government had provided line of credit to this project as part of India's bid to establish better connectivity between SAARC nations.
 - This project will also play significant role in establishing connectivity between both nations as ferry service soon will be started from north-western Sri Lankan town of Talaimannar (the closest point to India) and Rameshwaram.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Anuradhapura shrine

- Prior to inaugurating this rail service, Prime Minister Narendra Modi offered prayers at the sacred Bodhi tree in Anuradhapura shrine.
- This is first time that an Indian Prime Minister is visiting Anuradhapura.
- The sacred Bodhi tree at Anuradhapura shrine was planted as a sapling of the original Bodhi tree, under which Lord Gautam Buddha had achieved enlightenment.
- It was planted 2000 years ago in Anuradhapura shrine which is considered as one of the most sacred places in Buddhism.
